President's Message

It is hard to believe that it is now November. Where did this year go? I am definitely not ready for winter yet. That's not good since it isn't very far away. By now, most of our summer songbirds are gone until spring. However, there are still lots of great opportunities to see fall migrants and winter visitors. In fact, the peak of the fall waterfowl migration is still on its way!!

The best waterfowl viewing locations in the area are the Goose Island closed area on the south end of Goose Island County Park and the Brownsville closed area south of Brownsville. Each of these locations has overlooks along the highway that allow you to get great looks at the birds. Lake Onalaska also has tremendous flocks of birds on the western side of the lake but the birds aren't as close and therefore harder to enjoy. However, Lake Onalaska is the spot where I have had the best luck over the years to find sea ducks including Scoters and this is the best time of the year to see them. (*con't on page 2*)

The waterfowl flocks typically peak in mid-November so this is the best time to check them out. On Sunday, November 10th, Coulee Audubon will be putting on a waterfowl viewing field trip. On Saturday, November 9th, I will be at the overlook in Ferryville helping people check out the birds on the river there. Ferryville is working on become a Wisconsin Bird City and this activity will help them to meet the requirements of that program. This year's La Crosse / La Crescent Christmas Bird count is coming up fast. It will be held on Saturday, December 14th and as always, we could really use your help. Field Trips

Mississippi River Waterfowl Viewing – November 10, 2013. We will meet at noon on the street behind the Kwik Trip at the stop lights in La Crescent. We will head south and checkout the mudflats below the entrance to the Wildcat Landing in Brownsville and we will also stop at the refuge overlooks just south of there. This is not the date of the US Fish & Wildlife Service viewing event so it won't be as crowded. This is a great opportunity to see thousands of Ducks, Geese and Swans.

Lake Michigan Lakefront Birding. (First or Second Saturday in January)

We will join the Wisconsin Society for Ornithology (WSO) field trip along the shore of Lake Michigan. The trip will be held on the first or second Saturday in January and starts at the South Shore Yacht Club in Milwaukee and goes as far north as Sheboygan. This trip is a great chance to see waterfowl including Scoters and Long-tailed Ducks as well as other specialties including Snowy Owls and rare gulls. We will carpool from La Crosse. Details will be announced via e-mail in December.

Other field trip possibilities:

Sax-Zim Bog weekend

We are talking about another weekend trip to Duluth to visit the Sax-Zim Bog and other local birding hotspots. We would stay overnight in Duluth on Friday and Saturday nights and bird all day on Saturday and for about $\frac{1}{2}$ day on Sunday. The Sax-Zim Bog is a special place where boreal specialties including Great Grey Owls, Northern Hawk Owls, Black-backed Woodpeckers, Pine and Evening Grosbeaks, Common and Hoary Redpolls, and Boreal Chickadees can be found. Northwoods Birding

We would spend a long day checking out the northwoods in WI. We would leave before dawn and return after dark with visits to several locations in the Clam Lake and Gordon areas in search of boreal birds.

La Crosse Christmas Bird Count – Saturday, December 14, 2013

For the La Crosse Christmas Bird Count, we count all of the birds that we can find inside of a 15-mile “count circle” that is centered on the La Crosse County courthouse. As always, we are looking for volunteers to count the birds at their feeder (if it is within the count circle) or to work by themselves or as a member of a team to count the birds in one of many pre-assigned sections of the count circle. We would like feeder counters to count all of the birds at their feeder on at least one occasion on the count day (multiple observations would be even better). Section counters are asked to commit to at least a few hours of birding. Birders of all skill levels are welcome!!

At the end of the day, all participants are invited to take part in a potluck and social event that allows participants to share their results with other members of the count team.
