We do ask the people joining the walks wear masks and practice social distancing. If the groups become too large, we will divide into smaller groups.


May 15 Wyalusing Field Trip

Vernon County Chimney Swift Project

The Vernon County Museum in Viroqua, WI is raising money to repair the Chimney, home to hundreds of Chimney Swifts. Contributions can be sent to the following address with a note indicating the money to be used for Chimney Swifts.

Coulee Region Audubon has donated \$500 to this important bird conservation project. Chimney Swifts are among those insectivores that are at risk due to declining insect populations and habitat loss. This project helps provide habitat for them. During "Swift Night Out," observers have witnessed hundreds of these flying cigars entering the roost.
