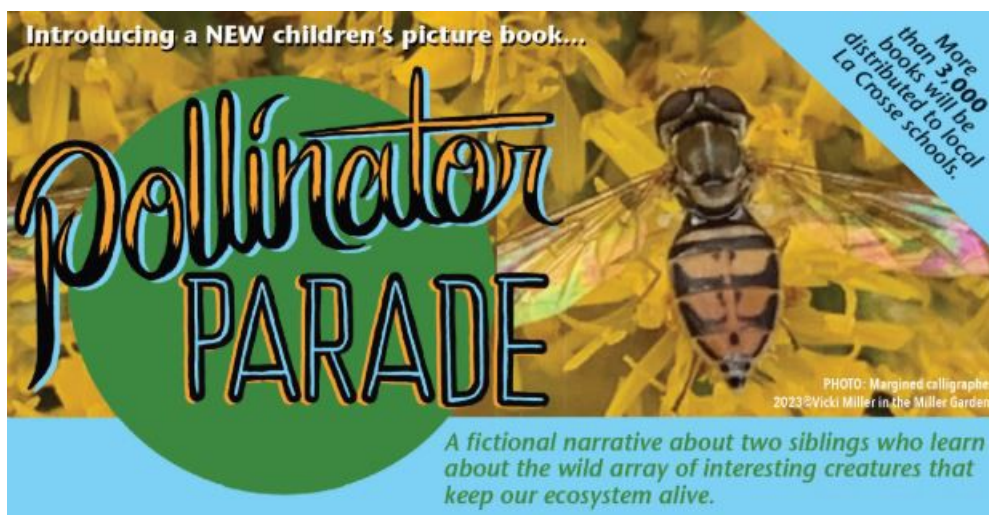
Christmas Bird Count
