Greetings fellow Coulee Auduboners!

Happy New Year!! May 2026 bring you and your family much joy and happiness! In 2025 the National Audubon Society celebrated their 120th Anniversary marking their founding in 1905, and celebrating 120 years of bird conservation. It's probably fair to say that in many peoples minds, Audubon is synonymous with bird conservation.

We should all celebrate Audubon's advocacy over the past 120 years in helping to pass landmark legislation to protect birds and bird habitat. This includes the Audubon Plumage Law in 1910 that protected wading birds from the plume industry, and the 1918 Migratory Bird Treaty Act - that made it illegal to kill any non-game bird in the U.S. (With the exception, of course, of European Starlings, House Sparrows and feral pigeons!) Also the Endangered Species Act of 1973, and many others.

Audubon continues to embrace and encourage citizen science projects like the Christmas Bird Count, which began in 1900, and which Coulee Audubon conducted locally this past December 20th. Audubon also fosters other types of community engagement - like encouraging people to share their personal “bird journeys”, using hashtags like #MyBirdJourney.

However you choose to be involved in bird conservation and bird habitat conservation, it's all important, as each of us can help make the world just a little bit better.
